English

Plants

- Identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees.

Maths

Number: *Place value to 50* -Read and write numbers to 50 -Ordering numbers -Representation of numbers

Addition and Subtraction to 20 -Revise and build on previously learnt skills and knowledge -Solve one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations, and missing number problems

Measurement: Height and Length -Compare lengths and heights [e.g, long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half] -Measure and begin to record lengths and heights

Music
