Home Learning

Maths

Number: Multiplication and Division *solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher *recognise, find and name a half as 1 of 2 equal parts of an object, shape or quantity *recognise, find and name a quarter as 1 of 4 equal parts of an object, shape or quantity *through grouping and sharing small quantities, pupils begin to understand: multiplication and division; doubling numbers and quantities; and finding simple fractions of objects, numbers and quantities.

Measurement: *Time* *sequence events in chronological order *recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years. *tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times *compare time
